COMPLEX LOGISTICS

Fully compliant to handle, store and manage dangerous goods. Over the last 12 months our team at Noble Park has been introducing a full suite of multifaceted temperature sensitive products to the operation.

Temperature controlled sections and a 100m² cool room set between 2–8°C, two more freezers have been added, one at -20°C and one at -80°C to ensure the quality of customers' temperature sensivtive products are not compromised. Temperature monitoring devices are mapped throughout all temperature controlled areas and monitored and reported on wirelessly by our team at all times.

A 434m² mezzanine deck and new rolledupright shelving (RUT) have been fitted to provide more options for small and complex storage and pick and pack requirements. The RUT shelves can all be reconfigured in order to find new solutions or be adjusted to accommodate different sized items. From a small glass bottle with content of 0.002kg right through to bulk pallet storage and drums of 1000kg, our Noble Park branch is handling freight of all shapes, sizes, quantities and specialised needs.

Drawing on our dangerous goods expertise and extensive logistics technology, our team is proficiently trained and understands the need for delicate and precise handling of dangerous goods and complex pick packing. We utilise RF scanning to capture inbound movement, stock control, replenishment and outbound movement by unit, case and pallet for complete transparency.


The new branch is located in the busy metropolitan area of Bangkok. We will initially focus on international trade coming in and out of Thailand and will be able to offer our customers:

A 3,500m² warehouse, large awning area and depot operations will ensure we receive, store and dispatch your product with maximum efficiency. With quarantine and bond licensing on the site we will offer a full suite of services ensuring we continue our growth and add further value to our customers.

5 MINUTES WITH ALADIN

NATIONAL BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT MANAGER (LOGISTICS)

Aladin, you have recently taken on the challenge of National Business Development Manager for our Logistics business, how did you get here?

The new challenge is great and will definitely bestow numerous opportunities to acquire new knowledge. Looking back over my eight years at Mainfreight, I initially started out as a Graduate spending time primarily in our domestic business. Mainfreight has always promoted from within and with a growing emphasis on developing people's full potential.

You were a big part of implementing the complex pick and pack changes to Noble Park. What was the most challenging/rewarding element?

The implementation component to the project extended over a 10 month period. Firstly, the

immense inventory profile meant we had to carefully redesign our system applications and warehouse operations to achieve the most optimum product handling flow. This included several weeks of System User Acceptance Testing and the construction of a Mezzanine Floor which now holds in excess of 3,000 unique bin locations. This increase in warehouse activity required the recruitment of an additional 10 highly skilled team members.

You are in the midst of building your own home, which venture is more challenging?

Each endeavour presents its own challenges. Going through the building process has taught me a number of great lessons – I've learnt that I enjoy being creative and finding solutions in moments which at first might appear to have none; the sheer importance of team work – my wife and I often



joke that it's impressive our marriage has survived the process; and ultimately, having consistent, enduring strength with the end goal in mind.

If we came to your house for dinner tonight, what would you prepare for us?

Spag Bol, rocket and parmesan salad with balsamic, with a glass (or two) of Rioja.

ARE YOU RUNNING FOR THE KIDS?

For the 9th year running, Mainfreight are getting behind the Melbourne landmark event Run for the Kids. Mainfreight team members and their families will join around 40,000 Victorians in the 15 km course and a 5km family friendly event which raises money for the Royal Children's Hospital Good Friday Appeal.

Last year the charity event raised a record breaking \$2 million which was spent on a state of the art simulations centre for The Royal Children's Hospital. The simulations centre will assist in the diagnosis and treatment of patients and will help train the medical team to perform delicate procedures.



Each year more and more team members take part in the run though Melbourne's city centre and Mainfreight encourage our team and extended Mainfreight family with t-shirts, morning tea and donating the entry fee which is automatically contributed to the charity.
