

INCORRECT GATE IN OF DANGEROUS GOODS

Ports of Auckland have recently received a number of Dangerous Goods containers that have been pre-advised as general containers or advised to the Road Office as such. Ports of Auckland considers this behaviour a serious issue due to the risk of health and safety risk to our staff and other users of the Port as well as it being a breach of Ports of Auckland's Dangerous Goods licence. To deter this type of behaviour and highlight the seriousness in which POAL views this, there will be a penalty payment for any Road Carrier found to have exhibited the above behaviour.

The Dangerous Goods penalty payment is as follows:

\$1000 + GST for failing to correctly advise Dangerous Goods cargo.

This will be charged to any carrier failing to properly advise delivery of a Dangerous goods container at POAL terminals or failing to advise the POAL R&D office at POAL Multi-Cargo wharves.

This charge will be in effect from 1st July 2011.
